

#### 1. Background

Water Corporation operates the Goldfields Water Supply (GWSS), which was opened in 1903, and today services more than 100,000 customers, farms, mines and other enterprises. The main conduit of the GWSS, or 'Goldfields Pipeline', spans some 560 kilometres between Mundaring Weir in the Perth Hills and the regional City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder. It remains one of the longest freshwater pipelines in the world. In 2011 the GWSS was included on the National Heritage List and is subject to the Commonwealth *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act).

Water Corporation manages operational components of the GWSS, along with several non-operational components of the scheme, including historic steam pumping stations and other assets. Other non-operational components of the GWSS are managed by the National Trust, some of which are managed in partnership with local government. Water Corporation's focus is on maintaining this scheme and supporting the expected population growth in the region into the future.

In January 2022 Water Corporation received approval under the EPBC Act to gradually remove and repurpose above-ground sections of the Goldfields Pipeline ('the Action'). The Action commenced 15 March 2022 with the removal of two approximately 8-metre sections of pipeline in Tammin, which was part of the 'preliminary works' relating to the Action. No further components of the Action have been commenced. The balance of works will be completed for the 560 km pipeline over the 70-year term of the approval.

#### 2. Scope

The former Australian Department of Agriculture Water and the Environment (DAWE), now Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW), issued an approval under sections 130(1) and 133(1) of the EPBC Act for the Action in January 2022.

Condition 13 of this approval requires the approval holder to prepare a compliance report for each 12-month period following the date of commencement of the action. The report is to be published on Water Corporation's website within 60 business days of the relevant 12-month period.

This report details Water Corporation's progress towards completion of the Action and compliance with the approval conditions of EPBC 2019/8547 and forms the first Compliance Report since commencement of the Action.

The purpose of the testing was to identify potential contaminants in the pipe coating, to ensure the pipe is suitable, or can be suitably treated, so that it can be safely used for interpretation, conservation or artistic reuse in accordance with Condition 3b. Due to this, and delays in updating the project website, Water Corporation advised it was unable to complete and publish the annual Compliance Report within the timeframe required by the approval.  On 31 July 2023, Water Corporation further corresponded with the Department and proposed to address the non-compliance by completion of the Compliance Report in accordance with Condition 13 by 27 October 2023.  Water Corporation has now completed and published the Compliance Report and therefore addressed non-compliance with Condition 13.

#### 5. Summary

During the reporting period Water Corporation commenced the Action by removal of two sections of pipe in Tammin, which forms part of the Preliminary Works under the Action. We also undertook important steps towards completion of an Interpretation Strategy and Heritage Management Plan in accordance with the approval conditions.

Water Corporation completed an Archival Record for its project at Tammin. Water Corporation also completed Archival Records for future projects at Merredin and Baandee, however the Action has not commenced with respect to these projects as the extant pipe has not been removed.


Water Corporation did not supply a copy of the Archival Record to the Australian Heritage Council for the Tammin project due to the very minor nature of the works (removal of circa 16m of pipeline out of the 560 km long main conduit), and notes non-compliance with Condition 3b. Water Corporation propose to address the non-compliance by providing a copy of the Archival Record for Tammin to the Australian Heritage Council when seeking endorsement for its Heritage Management Plan in accordance with Condition 1.

Water Corporation also notes non-compliance with Condition 13 due to the delay in publication of this report and its provision to the Department. Water Corporation has now completed and published the Compliance Report and therefore addressed non-compliance with Condition 13.



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
#### Attachment 1 – Location of Tammin Works
